BIOGRAPHICAL NOTES

MISS F. A. BROOK, B.Sc. - Assistant Overseas Secretary

Miss F. A. Brook, B.Sc. came from St. Budeaux, Plymouth, and Silver Street, Taunton, was educated in Plymouth and graduated at the London University. She trained as a teacher and had a post in Cheshire before her appointment to the Ceylon Mission in 1939. After a course of special missionary training at Carey Hall, Birmingham, she proceeded to the field and served at the Ferguson High School at Ratnapura, Ceylon. In October 1960 she returned to this country and, owing to family reasons, later resigned. In April 1966 she was appointed as Assistant Overseas Secretary to the Society, with responsibility for candidates, and commenced her duties in September. She is a member of the church at Paines Lane, Pinner and her special interests are the S.C.M. and Girl Guides.

MISS J. PELL, S.R.N., S.C.M. - Baraut, North India

Miss J. Pell, S.R.N., S.C.M., is in membership at the Eastgate Baptist Church, Lewes, Sussex, and after receiving her missionary training at Carey Hall, Solly Oak, Birmingham, was appointed for service in India in 1961. She went first to Salamatpur, and then in 1963 to Baraut where she has been doing district medical and evangelistic work. She is now home on her first furlough. Her special interests are the Girls' Brigade and the I.H.N.C.F.

MISS EDNA THROUP, S.R.N., S.C.M. - Ludhiana, North India

Miss Edna Throup, S.R.N., S.C.M., came from Rodley Baptist Church, Leeds, and was appointed to the India Mission in 1931. She served at the Men's Hospital, Palwal, until 1954, and was then transferred to the staff of the Christian Medical College and Hospital at Ludhiana, North India, as Nursing Superintendent. This Hospital is concerned with the training of Christian Medical and Nursing personnel from, and for, many places all over India. She returned to this country in 1957, and before her retirement served for two years as Warden of the Home for Retired Missionaries at Worthing.

DR. MICHAEL FLOWERS, M.B., CH.B. - Chandraghona Mission
Hospital, East Pakistan

Dr. Michael Flowers, M.B., Ch.B., is the son of a distinguished medical missionary, the late Dr. W. S. Flowers, of China. A member of the Moortown Baptist Church, Leeds, he graduated at the Leeds University Medical School in 1958, was appointed to work in Asia in 1960, and has since been serving at the Arthington (Baptist Mission) Hospital, Chandraghona, East Pakistan. He is married with four children and his special interests are the Crusaders and the I.V.F.
