INSTRUCTIONS.

A strict regard to the movements of Mr. Dean, the Conductor, is indispensable.

Previous to Singing, a Roll on the Drums will be given, as a call for ATTENTION. Each tune will be played over by the Band, and *immediately afterwards* the singing of the same will commence. The THIRD HYMN commences with a *horizontal* movement of the Conductor's bâton. The Chorus, "THE HEAVENS ARE TELLING," commences with an *upward* movement. THE NATIONAL ANTHEM and all the other Hymns and Choruses commence with a *downward* movement.

The figures printed above the Treble line of the Choruses, are simply to mark places convenient to refer to at Rehearsals.

CHOIRS.—Please notice that the Choruses are printed in Vocal-Score, each part having its own line, whilst the Hymn Tunes are printed in Short-Score, which requires the Tenors to sing from the Bass Clef. There are some parts of the Choruses marked "Choirs only," in which, of course, the Scholars will not join. There is one passage on the 19th page where there are two sets of notes in the Treble line; in this place Treble singers take the lower notes, and Scholars the upper notes.

GIRLS AND BOYS.—In "THE HEAVENS ARE TELLING" sing the Treble line, except where marked "Choirs only." In "BEETHOVEN'S HALLELUJAH" sing the Treble line all through. In "HANDEL'S HALLELUJAH" the Girls sing the Treble line, except where marked "Choirs only." The Boys sing the Treble line where marked G. and B., and the Tenor line where marked B. and continued by dotted lines.

NOTE.—Mr. Dean's arrangement of "Handel's Hallelujah," for Girls and Boys, is combined with the present Copy.
